If you have been receiving emails about Jurisprudence or External Feedback, it is time to sign into your profile and complete these tasks.

Returning to Work After a Leave of Absence

If you are returning from a maternity leave or another leave of absence and currently hold Non-Practicing status, please remember to change your registration status to Registered (General) **prior** to your first day at work.

To change your status, login to your account in our online system and click "Reinstate". Make the appropriate changes and click submit. After your reinstatement has been approved, you will receive an email instructing you to pay the outstanding invoice. Please allow at least one week for processing your status change.

Remember that under the *Health Professions Act (HPA*) it is illegal and an offence for a person to work or volunteer as an SLP or audiologist in Alberta until such time that they are registered with ACSLPA and have a practice permit.

All registered members, practicing and non-practicing, should have received an email on Monday August 23 at noon with a unique access key which can only be used to vote once. Your voting choices will remain anonymous. Do not forward or reply to your email to vote, as your vote will not be registered.
